Course: A Survey of the Bible: Genesis to Revelation Lesson: 20_4 - God, Job, Satan - Why Suffering? (Job 2)

For whatever things were written before were written for our learning, that we through the patience and comfort of the Scriptures might have hope.

(Romans 15:4)

Another Day (Job 2:1-6)

- We do not know how many days have gone by between the close of chapter one and the beginning of chapter two.
- The scene is exactly like the first one in 1:6-7.
- **NOTE AGAIN** that it is the Lord who takes the <u>initiative</u>. God had **purpose** for all that He does!
- NOTICE that Satan had nothing to boast about! Satan <u>lost</u> his "contest" with God! (see 1:9-11) Job did worship when all was taken away from him!
- Again God asks Satan if he considered My servant . . .
 - "there is none like him on earth!"
 - "a blameless and upright man"
 - "one who fears God"
 - "one who shuns evil"
 - "one who holds fast to his integrity (Lauterkeit)"
- (v 3) **NOTE CAREFULLY** that God accepts the responsibility of being the Agent behind the attacks on Job!
- (v. 3) "without cause"
- (vv. 4-5) Satan again tells God to **stretch out <u>HIS</u> hand!** Satan **knows** that he has **no** power to do as he would like!
- (vv. 4-5) Satan says, "Any man would certainly give up all that he had
 if his own life was spared! Make <u>Job</u> suffer physically and he will
 curse you to your face!" SKIN for skin!

(v. 6) God gives Satan permission (and the power) to do whatever he
pleases to Job. <u>BUT</u> God also <u>limits</u> Satan by <u>not</u> giving Satan
power over Job's life!

Satan's Work (v. 7)

- Satan strikes Job with painful boils from the sole of his foot to the top of his head.
- The consequences of these boils are referred to throughout the book;
 - **✗** maggots in ulcers (7:5)
 - **✗** cracking skin and breaking out with fresh sores (7:5)
 - ★ terrifying dreams (7:14)
 - ✗ running tears blinding the eyes (16:16)
 - **X** repulsive breathe
 - **x** erosion of bones (30:17)
 - **✗** constant gnawing pain (30:17)
 - ★ blackening skin (30:30)
 - **X** fever (30:30)
- Satan did all he could do to turn Job against God!
- (v. 8) Maybe to prevent the spread of infection, Job scraped himself.
- Job's skin became so disfigured that his friends did not recognize him. (2:12)

A Very Hard Test (v. 9)

- Job's wife tells Job, "Curse God and die! Give up your integrity! It is better to die than to suffer this way!" THIS IS EXACTLY WHAT SATAN WANTED!
- Added to his pain, suffering, and agony his <u>helpmate</u> gives up on him!

• BUT REMEMBER:

- She, too, just lost all of her children.
- She, too, lost her welfare.
- NOW she has to watch the man she has shared her entire life with suffer all this pain.
- "When life is difficult it is <u>easy</u> to give up, but giving up is the <u>worst</u> thing we can do!" (WWW)

Job's Response (v. 10)

- Job accuses his wife of being "foolish" () nabal {naw-bawl'}) this has more to do with "godless" than silliness. See Psalm 14:1; 53:1
 - It also has the idea of being "stupid" and "wicked" "The beginning of wisdom (opposite of "stupid") is the fear of God." (Job 28:28; Psalm 111:10; Proverbs 1:7; 9:10)
- Job understood that <u>both</u> good and evil ultimately came from the will of and counsel of God. Lamentations 3:37-38; Ephesians 1:11; Ecclesiastes 7:13-14; **Job 42:11**; Isaiah 45:7; Amos 3:6)
- IN SAYING THIS JOB DID NOT SIN WITH HIS LIPS!!!

Job's Friends (vv. 11-13)

- The good qualities of Job's friends:
 - ① They cared enough to travel long distances to visit him.
 - 2 They went where he was the ash heap garbage dump!
 - 3 They did not say anything for seven days.
- However, in the end, God rebukes all three friends for their "compassion" on Job! (Job 42:7-10)
