- He is a master counterfeiter. (1 Timothy 4:1; Matthew 7:21-23; 2 Peter 2:1-3; 3:17; Matthew 16:6, 12)
- He is very well organized. (Ephesians 6:12)

Things (LIES) That People Accept Without Testing

THIS LIST IS A LIST OF BELIEFS THAT HAVE CHANGED OVER THE COARSE OF THE PAST 150 YEARS.

THESE BELIEFS ARE ALL BASED ON THE TEACHINGS OF MEN and NOT THE WORD OF GOD.

MANY WHO ACKNOWLEDGE THAT THEY ARE CHRISTIANS HAVE ACCEPTED THESE AS TRUTH <u>WITHOUT</u> DILIGENTLY TESTING THEM BY THE WORD OF GOD.

- IF YOU HAVE NEVER TESTED THESE BY YOUR OWN STUDY OF GOD'S WORD THEN YOU HOLD TO AN OPINION OF ANOTHER RATHER THAN THE WORD OF GOD.
- 1. Bible STUDY is not NECESSARY for modern day Christians. You can be saved without being a disciple (student) of Christ. (Luke 9:23; 10:42; 4:4; Matthew 4:4; John 17:17; Psalm 119:160)
- 2. The study of and living doctrine is not necessary for the Christian life. (2 Timothy 2:15; 3:16-17; 4:1-4; 1 Timothy 4:13-16)

- 3. Tithing is a Jewish thing. Christians are not required to tithe what God gives them. Give whatever you feel like giving or not giving.
 - (Genesis 14:20; 28:19-22 [these is before the Law]; Leviticus 27:30-32 [the tithes were "holy unto the LORD"]; Matthew 23:33 [notice the phrase, "and not to leave the other undone"]; Malachi 3:10; 2 Corinthians 8:14 ["But by an equality . . . "]; Hebrews 7:5-6; Luke 12:48)
- 4. Being valiant for the truth is not necessary.

(Jeremiah 9:3: Jude 3)

- 5. Assembling for worship, fellowship, study and prayer are not necessary. (Acts 2:42-46; Hebrews 10:25; 1 Corinthians 14:23)
- 6. Church membership is not necessary. One can be a Christian without being an active, serving, committed member of a local church.
 - → Membership is defined by "the church" NOT by God.

(Ephesians 5:30-31; 1 Corinthians 12:12-27; Romans 12:4-5)

- 7. Christianity is a personal/private thing. It is not a corporate thing. You can be the Christian you want to be and are not responsible to others. (Romans 12:4-5; 1 Corinthians 12:12-27)
- 8. Christianity is a religion not an intimate relationship with Christ and a very distinct way of life.(John 3:1-8; 17:1-3; James 1:18; 1 John 3:1-10)
- 9. One can be a Christians without growing and maturing in their faith.

 (1 Peter 1:5-10; 2:1-2; 2 Peter 3:18; Ephesians 4:11-16; Hebrews 5:12-14)
- Taking the Lord's name in vain is not big thing. OMG is not taking God's name in vain - it is just an expression that many use. (Exod 20:7; Deut 5:11)
- 11. Obeying elders/pastors is not required. You do not have to obey what the pastor/elder teaches or preaches. (Hebrews 13:7, 17; 1 Thessalonians 55:12-13; 1 Timothy 5:17)
- 12. Doing the will of God, as revealed in the Word of God, is not necessary to get to heaven. (Matthew 7:21; 12:50; Luke 11:28; John 14:15, 21, 23-24; 15:10, 13-14; 1 John 2:3-4, 17; 5:1-3)
- 13. A little false doctrine does not leaven the whole bunch. (Matthew 16:6-12; Luke 12:1; 1 Corinthians 5:6; Galatians 5:9)
- 14. One does not have to forgive others even as God has forgiven them. (Matt 6:14-15; Eph 4:32; Col 3:12-13; 1 John 2:12; Matt18:21-22)
- 15. One does not have to love others even as God loves them. (John 13:34-35; 15:12-13, 17; Eph 5:2; 1 John 3:16-18; 4:7-11, 21; 5:1)
- 16. One does not have to receive others even as Christ has received them. (Romans 15:7)
- 17. One can pray anyway they want and God will hear them. How we pray and what we pray is of no real significance.(Matthew 6:5-13; 1 John 3:22-24)

- 18. One can have saving faith without doing those things that God commands in His Word. (James 2:14-26; Ephesians 2:10; Titus 2:14)
- 19. Truth is relative. There is no absolute truth. (Psalm 119:142, 151, 160; John 17:17; Psalm 96:13)
- 20. Homosexuality is not an abomination to God. (1 Cor 6:9-10; Galatians 5:19-21; Revelation 21:8; 22:15)
- 21. Sex outside marriage and living together without being married is acceptable. (1 Corinthians 6:9-10; Galatians 5:19-21; Ephesians 5:4-5; Hebrews 13:4; Revelation 21:8; 22:15)
- 22. Killing of babies inside and outside the womb is acceptable.
 (Exodus 20:13; 21:14, 22-25; ; Psalm 139:13-16; 127;3-5; Jer 1:5)
 23. Divorce is permissible. (Malachi 2:16; Mark 10:11-12; Luke 16:18; 1
- 23. Divorce is permissible. (Malachi 2:16; Mark 10:11-12; Luke 16:18; 1 Corinthians 7:10-11; Romans 7:2; our vows prohibit us from divorce; separation is allowed but not divorce.)
- 24. The serious and diligent education of our children about who God is and what He demands is not necessary. (Deuteronomy 4:9-10; 6:7-9; 11:19; Psalm 78:1-8; Ephesians 6:4; Proverbs 22:6)
- 25. Disciplining our children in accordance with the Word of God is unacceptable. (Proverbs 22:15; 23:13-14; 29:15; 29:17)
- 26. Roles of women and men must keep up with culture and not be followed by God's Word. (Genesis 1:26-27)
- 27. Individuals define what and who a Christian is NOT GOD. (2 Timothy 3:16-17; Luke 9:23; 14:26-33; all the Epistles)
- 28. The fourth commandment is only for the Jews and not for Christians. God no longer requires that His people give Him one day. Christians are free to take all seven days for themselves.
 - → One day is not necessary. 1-2 hours and then do as we please.
 - → Christians are bound to 9 not 10 commandments.

(Exodus 20:8-11; 16:23-30; Leviticus 23:3; Genesis 2:3; Isaiah 56:2-13; **58:13-14;** Jeremiah 17:19-27; 7:22-28; 1Hebrews 10:25; Ezekiel 20:12-16; 22:8; Nehemiah 13:15, 21, 22; Mark 2:27-28)

- → Vacations with family is a legitimate reason for not giving God His one day. (2 Timothy 3:1-5)
- 29. Christ accepts a minimum standard for being one of His disciples. (Luke 9:23; 14:26-33)
- 30. Individuals can define what is and what is not sin for themselves. (1 John 3:4: 5:17)
- 31. One can say, "Christ is number one in my life," but still place Him below the number one spot when making decisions. Family and career requirements are more important than Church.

 (Matthew 22:36-38; 10:37; Luke 14:26-27; Philippians 3:8)

- 32. Following the commandments of God is not necessary for a Christian. (1 John 2:3-6; 5:1-3; John 14:15; 15:10, 14, 21, 23-24)
- 33. Works have no place in Christianity. (Titus 2:11-14; James 2:14-26; Ephesians 2:10)
- 34. One can say, "the Bible is the final authority for all that we believe and practice (do)," but be ignorant of what it actually says or not believing that I really have to follow it carefully and diligently. (James 1:22; 1 John 2:3-4)
- 35. The meaning of God's Word changes with time, culture and tradition. (Jude 3; John 17:17; Hebrews 13:8)
- 36. Gospel messages that are not strictly in accordance to what Paul taught and preached are still acceptable. (Galatians 1:6-9)
- 37. Different interpretations of truth are acceptable. (This just is illogical. Truth, by definition, cannot mean different things.)
- 38. One cannot be deceived if they have prayed for Christ to come into their hearts.(Galatians 1:6: 3:1)
- 39. How one dresses for worship and for every day life is not dictated in God's Word. (1 Corinthians 11:2-16; 1 Timothy 2:9-10)
- 40. Christianity is something you add to your life. It is not your life. You have your religious life and a secular life. You must live your secular life but your religious life can be a lower priority. (2 Corinthians 5:17; John 3:3-8; Luke 14:33; Galatians 2:20)
- 41. When on vacation you can be on vacation from God (worship, study, fellowshipping with other Christians, etc.). (2 Tim 3:1-5; Hebrews 10:25; Exodus 20:8-11; Deut 5:12-14; Isaiah 56:4-6; 58:13-14)
- 42. As long as you are sincere in what you believe God accepts you. (Matthew 7:21-29; 12:50; 1 John 2:17)
- 43. Focusing on obedience to the commandments of God is legalism.

 (BUT biblically GOD calls it obedience and obedience in the only evidence of our love for God.) (John 14:15, 21, 23-24; 15:10, 13-14; 1 John 5:3)
- 44. Tradition and culture define truth. (John 17:17; 2 Timothy 3:16-17; Psalm 119:142. 160; Jeremiah 6:16-17)
- 45. Family is more important than following Christ. (Matthew 10:37-38; Luke 14:26-33)
- 46. The Law has no place in the New Testament.

 (Psalm 1:1-3; Psalm 119; John 14:15, 21, 23-24; 15:10, 13-14; 1 John 2:3-6; 5:1-3)
- 47. One does not have to obey the commandments (imperative verbs) of the New Testament. (John 8:31; 14:15, 21, 23-24; 15:10, 13-14; 1 John 5:3)
