2 Peter 1:5-9

Ephesians 1:1-14 Philippians 3:12-21



#### Lies Believed to Be Truth

 LIE #5 - It is not necessary to know God as He has revealed Himself in the written Word. Understanding God according to my tradition/opinion is sufficient.

## Author (2 Peter 1:1)

- Slave and Apostle of Jesus Christ.
- His word has EQUAL authority to Christ's Word. To reject Peter's word is to reject Christ and GOD Himself. (Luke 10:16)

## Addressees (2 Peter 1:2)

- Those who "obtained precious faith" by divine appointment.
- Those who were "appointed to eternal life" (Acts 13:38).
- (1 Peter 1:1-2) Pilgrims (Hebrews 11:13); Elect (Ephesians 1:4); sanctified by the Spirit (2 Thess 2:13-14); sprinkled with the blood of Christ (Heb 9:12); secure in the everlasting covenant! (Heb 13:20)

## **EVERYTHING NEEDED!** (2 Peter 1:3-4)

- We have been *granted* (PERFECT TENSE) <u>everything</u> we need for this life and godliness.
- We have been *granted* (PERFECT TENSE) <u>exceedingly great promises</u> from God Himself.
- We are <u>partakers</u> of the <u>divine</u> <u>nature</u>!

## **ALL Blessings** (Ephesians 1:3)

- Paul tells us that God has "blessed us with <u>every</u> spiritual blessing <u>in Christ!</u> He lists those blessing in verse 4-14!
  - ① God chose us! (v. 4)
  - ② God predestined us to adoption into His family. (vv. 5, 11)
  - 3 God has accepted us! (v. 5)
  - ④ God has redeemed us! (v. 7)

- ⑤ God has forgiven our sins. (v. 7)
- 6 God has poured His grace upon us. (vv. 7-8)
- 7 God has reserved an inheritance. (v. 11)
- ® God sealed us with His guarantee His Holy Spirit. (vv. 13-14)
- All this "according to the good pleasure of <u>His</u> will" (v. 5); "to the praise of the glory of <u>His</u> grace" (v. 6); "according to the riches of <u>His</u> grace" (v. 7); "according to His good pleasure" (v. 9); "which He purposed in <u>Himself</u>" (v. 9); "according to the purpose of <u>Him</u> . . . who works all things according to the counsel of <u>His</u> will" (v. 11); "to the praise of <u>His</u> glory" (v. 12); "to the praise of <u>His</u> glory" (v. 14)

## Having Escaped the Pollution of the World (2 Peter 1:4)

- Saints are no longer "citizens" of <u>this</u> world; their citizenship is, already, in heaven. (Philippians 3:20-21)
- Saints declare that they are "strangers and pilgrims on the earth". (Hebrews 11:13-16: Colossians 1:13: John 17:14-16)
- This world, sin, and Satan no longer have **dominion** (rule) over us! We are "in Christ"! (Rom 6:13-14; Hebrews 2:14; 1 John 3:8; Acts 26:18)
- Since we are no longer "of this world" we live differently from those who are still "of the world". (1 John 3:6-10)

## "For This Very Reason" (v. 5)

- ONLY <u>after</u> Peter (really the Holy Spirit) has laid out <u>ALL</u> that God has done for us does he now delivers to us <u>imperatives</u> or <u>commands</u>.
- A saint's **joyful obedience** is always in response to all that God has done for the saint! Our obedience is our response to God's grace, mercy, and love! (John 14:15, 21, 23,24; 15:10; 1 John 5:1-3)
- (Romans 12:1-2) In view of all of God's mercies (Romans 1-11) "PRESENT your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is <u>reasonable</u> service. And be not <u>conformed</u> to this world but be <u>transformed</u>."

#### "Giving ALL Diligence" (v. 5)

- "diligence"  $\sigma\pi\sigma\nu\delta\dot{\eta}\nu$  "earnestness in accomplishing"; "striving after anything"; "interest one's self most earnestly".
- "all"  $\pi\hat{\alpha}\varsigma$  (pas) (NIV, ESV, HCSB, NET, NLT "make every <u>effort</u>"); (KJV, NKJV "giving all diligence"); (NASB "applying all diligence")
- (Philippians 2:12-13) "WORK out your salvation with fear and trembling."
  - → (John 6:27) "Do not <u>labor</u> for the food which perishes, but <u>labor</u> for the food which endures to everlasting life . . ."
  - → (1 Corinthians 9:24-27) **RUN** the race to win it!
  - → (1 Corinthians 15:58) "THEREFORE, . . . always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that your labor is not in vain in the Lord."

- "add" is ἐπιχορηγέω epichoregeo "give lavishly, generously"; "supply";
  "provide all that is need" (IMPERATIVE; ACTIVE)
  - ★ The prefix **epi** "supersizes" the verb.
- ALL those who have been "born-again" **grow**! Where there is life there is growth! Where there is no growth, there is no life.

### ADD to Your Faith! (2 Peter 1:5-7)

- VIRTUE: ἀρ∈τή arete "moral excellence"; "moral heroism"; "when something fulfills its purpose in excellence"; "righteousness" (Matthew 6:33) See Proverbs 31:10-31 a virtuous wife. HOW? Fear God and keep His commandments (Ecclesiastes 12:13-14)
- **EXECUTE:** When the result is a knowledge of divine truth and the right use of that knowledge. (Romans 12:1-2; Hebrews 5:14) Peter exhorts us to "grow in knowledge" (2 Peter 3:18) See Ephesians 5:15-17. The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge and wisdom. (Proverbs 1:7; 9:10) This knowledge leads to a growing intimate relationship with God NOT RELIGION. HOW? Be a serious student of God's Word. (2 Timothy 2:15)
- SELF-CONTROL: "to hold oneself in"; This is living a <u>disciplined</u> life as a runner preparing for a race. (1 Corinthians 9:24-27) (See Proverbs 16:32; 25:28) HOW? Don't let the world dictate your life (Romans 12:1-2)
- PERSEVERANCE: This is ὑπομονή hupomone. "In the NT the characteristic of a man who is not swerved from his deliberate purpose and his loyalty to faith and piety by even the greatest trials and sufferings." Only those who persevere will be saved. (Matthew 10:22; 24:13; Hebrews 12:1-2; 3:6, 14; 10:39; Romans 2:7) HOW? (Prov 4:23-26)
- **⊚** GODLINESS: The fear, reverence, and love of/for God demonstrated in obedience to His commandments. We are exhorted to "exercise ourselves in godliness". (1 Timothy 4:7-8; see Titus 2:12) HOW? 1 Timothy 4:7-8
- BROTHERLY KINDNESS: This is obeying the second great commandment, "Love your neighbor as you love yourself." (Matthew 22:35-40) This is also the love of our enemies! (Luke 6:35) See 1 Peter 1:22; Hebrews 13:1; Romans 12:10) HOW? DO IT!
- ◆ LOVE: This is love for the brethren. He who does not love his brother is still in darkness NOT SAVED. (1 John 2:9-10; 3:10, 14-16, 17; 4:20-21) By this virtue the world will know that we are the disciples of Christ. (John 13:34-35) HOW? Lay down your life for your brethren! (1 John 3:16)
- → God has equipped us with EVERYTHING we need to do what He commands! (2 Peter 1:3-4; Galatians 5:22-23; Philippians 2:13; Romans 5:5)
- → God has <u>predestined</u> ALL His elect to do these things and grow in sanctification! (Romans 8:29; Philippians 1:6)

#### **PURSUE the VIRTUES of GOD**

• "pursue" is  $\delta\iota\acute{\omega}\kappa\omega$  dioko - "to run swiftly in order to catch something"; "to press

on as in a race" (Philippians 3:12-14).

- The opposite of "pursue" is to "flee from".
- Throughout the New Testament we are to pursue:
  - → (Romans 14:19) **PEACE** with each other. (Psalm 34:14)
  - → (Romans 14:19) **EDIFICATION** of each other. (Romans 15:2; 1 Cor 14:12-26)
  - → (1 Corinthians 14:1) **LOVE** for each other.
  - → (1 Thessalonians 5:15) What is **GOOD** for others.
  - → (1 Timothy 6:11) **RIGHTEOUSNESS**. (Matthew 6:33)
  - → (1 Timothy 6:11) **GODLINESS**. (1 Timothy 4:7-8)
  - → (1 Timothy 6:11) **FAITH**. (Hebrews 11:6)
  - $\rightarrow$  (1 Timothy 6:11) **PATIENCE** (ὑπομονη, endurance).
  - → (1 Timothy 6:11) **GENTLENESS**.
  - → (Matthew 5:48) **PERFECTION.** (Philippians 3:12-14)
  - → (Hebrews 12:14) **HOLINESS** without which NO ONE will see God.
- One's progress in maturing as a Christian ought to be evident to ALL. (1 Timothy 4:16)

#### Useful and Fruitful (2 Peter 1:8-9)

- (John 15:8) God is glorified when we "bear <u>much</u> fruit", showing ourselves to be true disciples of Christ.
- A Christian is "virtuous" (excellent); fulfilling his purpose when he/she glorifies God in all that he/she does! (1 Corinthians 10:31; 6:19-20; Philippians 1:11)
- ONLY when these virtues are <u>abounding</u> in us <u>and</u> increasing can we be useful and fruitful – "virtuous"!
- Christians **grow** spiritually when they **pursue** these virtues!
- Even true Christians <u>backslide</u> and become unfruitful and useless to God! Peter warns us in verse 9, that in our unfruitfulness, idleness, uselessness we become "short-sighted (self-centered), blinded, and have **forgotten** that his/her sins were <u>purged</u> by God".

#### What Must We Learn & DO

- ① We must "meditate on God's Word day and night" to remember all that God has done for us and in response become **FRUITFUL**. (Psalm 1:1-3; Jeremiah 17:5-8; John 15:1-8)
- ② We must **grow** as "children of God" by using the means that God has given us His Word, prayer, His Church. (2 Pete 3:17-18; 1:5-8)
- ③ We must <u>work</u> out <u>our</u> salvation, knowing that it is God working is us for His pleasure. (Philippians 1:6; 2:12-13; Romans 8:29)

Either we are **ABUNDANTLY ADDING** to our faith and **ACTIVELY PURSUING** the virtues of God or we are not! If we are not we are being disobedient - sinning. This is a serious command from God.
